### C. ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

Compliance with the Olympic Charter and other relevant rules





All athletes must respect and comply with the provisions of the Olympic Charter currently in force, including but not limited to Rule 41 (Nationality of Competitors) and Rule 43 (World Anti-Doping Code and the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of Manipulation of Competitions).

Only those athletes who respect and comply with the Olympic Charter, the World Anti-Doping Code and the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of the Manipulation of Competitions, including the conditions of participation established by the IOC, plus the rules of FINA, may participate in the Olympic Games Paris 2024.

#### Additional eligibility criteria/requirements

Only the athletes who are eligible to participate at the official FINA Competitions, in accordance with the FINA Rules GR 2.5, are entitled to participate in the Olympic Games Paris 2024.

each obtain one (1) quota place. If, for any reason, no team enters from a continent, or
if there is an unfilled vacancy from among the teams qualified from World
Championship Doha 2024, the next ranking team(s) will then be taken in order from
their placing at the Doha2024 World Championships Tournament - Men.

#### Women

<b>2 team</b> (24 Athletes)	20 <sup>th</sup> FINA World Championships – Fukuoka (JPN) 2022 to be held in 2023 The two (2) highest placing NOCs from the women's competition at the 20 <sup>th</sup> FINA World Championships – Fukuoka (JPN) (held in July 2023) will each obtain a quota place.
<b>1 team</b> (12 Athletes)	Host Country The Host Country NOC will automatically obtain a quota place. See Point F (below) for how an unused quota place will be reallocated.
<b>5 teams</b> (60 Athletes)	Continental QualificationThe highest placing NOC in each of the five (5) Continental Championships will each obtain a quota place. If the NOC is already qualified at the preceding 20th FINA World Championships – Fukuoka (JPN) (held in July 2023) (BL 9.3.10.3.3), then the next highest placed team from the respective Continental Championships will qualify. (FINA Rule BL 9.3.10.3.5)Should any of the Continental Championships not take place, the next highest placing NOC from that respective Continent at the <b>21st FINA World Championships Doha 2024</b> will obtain a quota place.Should there only be one representative from a specific continent, this NOC will obtain a quota place.
2 teams (24 athletes)	<b>21st FINA World Championships Doha 2024</b> The two (2) highest placing NOCs at the <b>21st FINA World Championships Doha 2024</b> will each obtain a quota place. If, for any reason, no team enters from a continent, or if there is an unfilled vacancy from among the teams qualified from World Championship Doha 2024, the next ranking team(s) will then be taken in order from their placing at the Doha2024 World Championships Tournament - Women.

### HOST COUNTRY PLACES

The host country is guaranteed one (1) team quota place per gender.

## E. CONFIRMATION PROCESS FOR QUOTA PLACES





#### **CONFIRMATION OF QUOTA PLACES**

Following each qualification event, FINA will publish the results on its website (<u>http://www.fina.org/</u>) and inform the respective NOCs of their allocated quota places.

The NOCs will then have 21 days to confirm if they wish to use these quota places, as detailed in paragraph **H. Qualification Timeline.** 

#### **CONFIRMATION OF HOST COUNTRY PLACES**

The host country shall confirm the use of the allocated quota places to FINA two (2) weeks after the end of the **21st FINA World Championships Doha 2024.** 

## F. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

**REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES** 

Any unused quota places will be reallocated to the next highest placed NOC according to the ranking of the **21st FINA World Championships Doha 2024**, as applicable.

**REALLOCATION OF UNUSED HOST COUNTRY PLACES** 

Any unused Host Country quota place will be reallocated to the next highest ranked NOC, not yet qualified, according to the ranking of the Continental Championships (for Europe).

### G. AP ALTERNATE ATHLETES

#### AP ALTERNATE ATHLETES

Definition:

Ap athletes are non-competing athletes accredited in the "Ap" category who have different entitlements to competing athletes (accredited as "Aa") as described in the "Ap" accreditation quotas and conditions outlined in the IOC Accreditation Guide. These personnel are not part of the athlete quota as described in Paragraph **B**. **Quota Places**. "Ap" alternate athletes could become competing athletes only under the conditions outlined in the IOC/Paris 2024 Late Athlete Replacement policy.

<u>Eligibility</u>: "Ap" athletes must comply with the same eligibility rules as competing athletes as described in paragraph **C. Athlete Eligibility**.
